# 4. BASIC SKILLS TESTING REQUIREMENT

To earn your CTE program certificate (for programs with 450 hours or more),

students MUST successfully meet all requirements, and earn a passing

score on the Basic Skills Tests.

## 5. DETERMINING RESIDENCY STATUS FOR TUITION PURPOSES

To get the best tuition rate, a student must be classified as a Florida resident.

- This is a 3-step process:
  - Dependency: Determine if you are classified as dependent or independent.
  - Citizenship: Student or claimant must be a US Citizen or Eligible Non-Citizen.
- Florida Residency: Student or claimant must provide proof of establishing and maintaining legal residency in Florida for at least 12 consecutive months
- preceding the first day of classes. To find out additional information about
