Course Content:

Students are trained in the use of technical and flat-rate information systems, as well as a variety of hand and power tools. Training also includes the use of electronic diagnostic and other test equipment. Specialty training is provided in such areas as air conditioning, front-end alignment, and the use of computerized automotive repair data systems.

Instruction coincides with the eight (8) areas recognized by the ASE Education foundation for professional technician certification, and provides for eight (8) areas of specialization in Engine Repair, Automatic Transmission/Transaxle, Manual Drive Train and Axles, Suspension and Steering, Brakes, Electrical Systems, Heating and Air Conditioning, and Engine Performance. Students are encouraged to participate in the ASE Certification testing program during their training.
